Word from the President ---- Telfair Shop At Home Program

The Telfair County Chamber of Commerce is proud to announce that the "Telfair Shop at Home Program is available again for the upcoming Holiday Season." This program is designed to encourage residents to Shop Telfair First, keeping more of our tax dollars at home, where they belong.

Local businesses and industries are the lifeblood of our community. Last year over \$66,000 Shop at Home Check were purchased and used at Merchants in Telfair County. Revenue generated from sales tax helps pay for police and fire protection, roads, schools, recreation and a host of other government services that we take for granted each and every day. Simply stated, the more revenue that our community generates from sales tax collections, the amount that our local governments are dependent on property tax collections will be reduced and more services can be offered. One of the best ways that we can continue to improve our community's sales tax collections is by encouraging everyone in Telfair County to purchase goods and services locally, before traveling outside of the community to buy groceries and other goods.

As these Gift Checks are actual checks, payable by the Telfair County Chamber of Commerce, using them is simple: simply present your Gift Check as you check-out with your purchase. Your Gift Check will be honored just like a personal check from your checking account. It's that easy!!!

2010-2011 Telfair-Wheeler Youth Leadership Class

The 2010 Telfair Wheeler Youth Leadership Class met on November 18 at the McRae City Hall where instructors Joe Elton and Debbie Bullard talked with the students on how to manage stress.

Charles McCann and Jeff Hanner with the Georgia Rural Water Association discussed the role that GRWA has with public wastewater systems. They also gave a demonstration of how the sewer video van is used to video sewer lines for infiltration, inflow and roots. The class then visited the McRae Wastewater Treatment Plant and a Little Ocmulgee EMC power sub station.

Summary on stress by Holly Beasley, a student of this year's Leadership Class.... "Stress, the bane of everyone's existence, is in technical terms defined as the body's reaction to a change that requires a physical, mental or emotional adjustment or response. Sometimes, though, you just don't know what it is that you need to adjust. If you're stressed for time, sometimes you can't adjust your schedule or drop one of your previous obligations. Sometimes you just have to calm down and let it go for a little while. Take a break from your stress. Which leads me to this important question, what calms me down when stress is breathing down my neck?

The first thing that calms me down is animals. When I say animals, I mostly mean my cats. All animals calm me down to a degree but none quite like my cats. My cats know when I'm stressed or upset. They always come up to me to be loved on, but if I'm upset they want to play, they try to climb in my lap, they do everything they possibly can until I cheer up. They won't give up until they succeed either.

Little Ocmulgee is located off US Highway 441 just outside of McRae/Helena, Georgia. There is a 60 room lodge, meeting facilities and restaurant.


